BATTERY	Before initiate using vehicle, the batteries should be fully charged, Replace the bad/broken/damaged parts during inspection.
BRAKE	Check the brake pedal , when stepped it should be flexible and feels firm . And it returns to its original position with flexibility when released
ACCELERATOR PEDAL	Check the accelerator pedal ,when stepped and released it should return to its original position with full flexibility.
TIRES	Check the tires' pressure, pressure is around 22 psi. Check tires surface, remove any embedded objects you can find. Be sure no cracks or other damages to the tires, defective tires may cause accident while driving.
STEERING	Pull the steering wheel up and down ,check the tightness of steering wheel .Rotate the steering wheel right and left. Be sure no excessive free play and rattling sound .
REVERSER WARNING BEEPER	Check the reverse beeper, when the direction selecting switch be set at "REV", it should beep soundly.
LIGHTS	Check the signal lights, the brake lights and turning lights should be in proper working condition.




Check the lubricant capacity the rear axle contains, use a cleaned stick, stick it into the rear axle and reach the bottom, pull it out check the depth. The amount of oil should be around 0.8L.



Pull the steering wheel up and down, check the tightness of steering wheel. Rotate the steering wheel right and left. Be sure no excessive free play or rattling sound.




Check the tightness of the battery cables, make sure all the nuts are solidly tight. Loose nuts on the battery will cause sparks while operating.



TOUCHSCREEN INTRODUCTION



1.Blue tooth



Get your phone connected.

Step 1: Power on the vehicle.

Step 2: Enable Blue tooth function on your cell phone.

Step 3: Search for "CA-BT-XXXX" in your device list.

Step 4: Choose the device to establish the connections . now you can make phone calls or play music out of your phone.

Use the dial pad to enter the number you need to dial.

Tap button 🗷 to delete the entered characters one by one.

Press and hold Button 🗷 to continuously delete characters until all entered characters are deleted.

Tap button to dial the entered number.

Tap button to dial back the number of the last call.

Tap button to hang up the current call.

2.Radio



Store the sequence of stations:

When the automatic search station function is activated, the meter will automatically search for the local radio station, and the radio frequency number is stored in the local, convenient for users to call and manage. Up to 50 stations can be stored, and 5 preset stations are displayed in each column of the left window area. If you need to turn the page to see the next set of stations, use the button

Storage station selection:

The two buttons \triangleleft and \triangleright can be used to select the previous/next station of the preset station, respectively

Stereo logo:

If the current station broadcasts in stereo and the current signal meets the stereo decoding requirements, the stereo activated or you can manually activate or deactivate it by using the switch

Current station store page serial number:

If the station being played has a serial number greater than 5, say the sixth station, because only five preset stations can be displayed per page, the current station will be stored on the second page, so the current position will be displayed FM2, and so on if you are playing the eleventh station, the current position will be displayed FM3

Radio frequency fine-tuning:

these two keys are mainly used to fine-tune the current radio frequency so that the signal demodulation is more accurate and the sound is clearer. Sometimes the frequency selected by the automatic search function may not be accurate, and this function can make up for the slight deficiency of the automatic search function

Pre-stored radio pagination selection

The button displays all the stations on the left side of the window by polling every 5 pages

Automatically search for stations:

Click the Q button to automatically search for all radio stations that you can listen to in your area, and automatically store the sequence on the left side of the window.

Stereo/Mono switching:

In theory, if the stereo broadcast signal is bad and affects listening, you can try switching to mono mode, and the effect may improve.

Local first:

This button will give preference to local stations and ignore non-local stations (which, in theory, will have a weaker signal).


The general recommended tire inflation pressure is 22 psi, but the tire inflation pressure can be changed according to the specific terrain condition.

All four tires must have the same pressure for the best control qualities. Always put the valve stem cap back after checking or inflate the tires.

Use a tire plug to repair small holes in the thread part of the tires. For large holes or cuts, replace the whole tire.

- >Thoroughly clean the front and rear body, seats, battery compartment and underside of the vehicle.
- >DO NOT engage the park brakes, but secure the golf cart from rolling. Chock the wheels with wheel stopper or something similar .
- >Check Tire pressure and inflate the tires to standard pressure level as values presented on tires.
